Marie's Zucchini-Chocolate Cake Bake 350 degrees for 30 minutes to one hour.

1/2 cup butter or margarine

1/2 cup oil

1 3/4 cup sugar

2 eggs

1/2 cup canned milk or sour cream

2 1/2 cup flour

1 tsp. soda

1/2 tsp. salt

1/2 tsp. cinnamon

4 tablespoons cocoa

1 1/2 tsp. vanilla

2-3 cup grated zucchinis (squeeze out juice)

a handful of chocolate chips

Frosting: 1 pound powered sugar, 1/2 cup margarine, 1 tsp. vanilla, milk to spreading consistency.

"Take 1 big slice of this cake with a glass of very cold milk. Sit down - get very comfortable, and thank Mother Nature for chocolate zucchinis."

I find myself without many words given the events of the past weeks. It comes back to celebrating the joy in the ordinary, like sharing a recipe, or some time with a dear friend.
